### SUMMERLEE HERITAGE PARK

11.25 am

HRH The Princess Royal arrives at Drumpelier Country Park, Coatbridge by helicopter accompanied by her Lady in Waiting Mrs David Bowes Lyon and Inspector Andrew Thomlinson, Protection Officer and is welcomed by Gilbert K. Cox MBE JP, Lord Lieutenant of Lanarkshire and Mrs Marjory Cox

#### Local School Children will be present

Mr Cox will escort HRH The Princes Royal to her car and the party will depart for Summerlee Heritage Park.

11.30 am

On arrival at Summerlee Heritage Park The Lord Lieutenant will introduce HRH The Princess Royal to:

11.32 am

HRH The Princess Royal escorted by Paul Jukes and Carol Haddow proceeds down main driveway. [Jim McGuinness will follow on escorting the official party on the tour] Primary schoolchildren as 'welcome party' on bank to left.

View Fire Queen Steam Launch on the water [crewed by David Cullen and John MacMillan].

11.37 am

Walk along east bank of the canal towards Howes Basin, past Ranger Service (Dermott McMahon Ranger on duty) with children 'pond-dipping' on nearside bank.

11.39 am Arrive at Howes Basin. HRH The Princess Royal views model boat activity and is introduced to members of:

11.41 am At Janet Hamilton bridge. Escorting staff briefed on background to Janet Hamilton poem which is on plaque on bridge.

Move towards steps to upper level and point out boatshed/conservation workshop.

11.42 am Arrive at tarmac open-space at top of steps.

No 53 (open-topped) tram parked at end of tramway, with party of school children playing traditional games in the open area in front of tram.

HRH The Princess Royal introduced to: Isobel MacDonald, Assistant Manager of Summerlee Maureen Mathieson, Class Teacher, St Augustines Primary School Sandra Craig, Visitor Services Assistant, Summerlee

11.45 am Arrive at Miners' Cottages.

HRH The Princess Royal will be introduced to Celestine Scanlon, Visitor Service Assistant who will be spinning at the entrance area of the street.

HRH The Princess Royal will be escorted into the 1910 cottage where she will meet Elizabeth McGinty, Visitor Services Supervisor.

Local school children will be taking part in a traditional washday in the washhouse and at open-air pump at the far end of the street supervised by Margaret O'Donnell, Visitor Services Assistant who will be introduced to HRH The Princess Royal.

[The following staff will also be in attendance in the Cottages in the event that the Royal Party wishes to enter the 1880/1840 or 1960 rooms: Alan Dick, Visitor Services Assistant in 1880/1840 room Deborah McGinty, Visitor Services Assistant in 1960 room]

HRH The Princess Royal will enter the 1940s cottage to be introduced to Linda Miller, Visitor Services Assistant and exit the cottage via the kitchen.

Moving into the back garden area of cottages, HRH The Princess Royal will be introduced to Harry Laird and C. Wilkie representatives of MI Technologies (New Deal Training Organisation) and R. Rosser and S. Kerr trainees.

Leaving back garden area of cottages, the party will proceed to end of lane, turn left and walk over to west end of mine area. Then proceed to Mine Shed to be introduced to Thomas Gallagher, Visitor Services Supervisor and Martin McPherson, Visitor Services Assistant who will explain the mine and invite her to view the mine entrance.

11.59 am HRH The Princess Royal is invited to view the Farme Colliery engine and is introduced to Allan Taggerty, Conservation Engineer.

12.03 am The full party are invited by Paul Jukes and Carol Haddow to board the Lanarkshire Tram [capacity: 39 seats] driven by Brian Quinn and Bob Sutherland of the Summerlee Transport Group at the Miners' Cottages Tram Stop.

Michael Chalton and Paul Geissler tramway staff will be introduced.

(HRH The Princess Royal and the Royal Party will take up front seats downstairs on tram behind driver and Jim McGuinness will direct the rest of the party to seats)

12.12 pm Tram departs for Exhibition Hall

12.15 pm Tram arrives at Exhibition Hall.

Party alights from tram

Brian Quinn of Summerlee Transport Group will present HRH The Princess Royal with a certificate commemorating her journey.

Steam machinery will be on parade outside hall. Vehicles will include:

The Sentinel (a large steam lorry) driven by Billy Sangster, Billy Bisset and Drew Wigfield volunteers from the Friends of Summerlee,

Fowler traction engine, driven by George McIntosh, Summerlee Site Assistant and John Convey, volunteer members of Friends of Summerlee,

"Tigger" (a small steam engine) driven by Richard Smith and Billy Adams (aged 12), volunteer members of Friends of Summerlee, and

The Robey Portable Engine driven by Jeff Haynes and Richard Samson, volunteer members of Friends of Summerlee

Party moves into hall, past Compton cinema organ being played by Duncan Sinclair, member of Scottish Cinema Organ Trust

HRH The Princess Royal is invited to view Tram which is being refurbished

Official Party escorted by Jim McGuinness exits Exhibition Hall and arrives at marquee on esplanade for luncheon.

Royal Party moves through into Bay Two area, and HRH The Princess Royal 12.24 am is introduced by Carol Haddow to the following Summerlee staff:

Party moves on through Exhibition Hall, past area with school children having 12.26 am a 'discovery' session. HRH The Princess Royal introduced to:

The Royal Party exits Exhibition Hall. HRH The Princess Royal is offered 12.31 am opportunity for Comfort Break/Buffet Lunch Light Refreshments in adjacent Conference Room accompanied by her Lady in Waiting and PPO.

> The Lord Lieutenant proceeds to the Marquee on the esplanade and the buffet lunch commences while awaiting HRH and Lady in Waiting.

> Ken Wilson, Department of Community Services asks assembled guests to take their places

The Lord Lieutenant and Paul Jukes will escort HRH The Princess Royal round assembled groups in Marquee.

### Assembled Guests in 9 Groups (of approximately 10 per group)

HRH The Princess Royal is invited onto platform. Provost Barry McCulloch officially welcomes Her Royal Highness to North Lanarkshire and invites her to sign the Visitors Book and Photograph. HRH will be asked to say a few words. Councillor James Logue, Convener, Community Services Committee will present HRH with a Miners Lamp to commemorate her visit to Summerlee Heritage Centre.

Gala Oueen Coleen Lamb (aged 12 years) will present a posy of flowers to 1.14 pm HRH The Princess Royal.

> HRH The Princess Royal bids farewell to the official party and exits via main drive accompanied by Lord Lieutenant and Paul Jukes to her vehicle. 'Tigger' minature steam traction engine will be operating in the locality.

Local primary school children formed up behind railings on west side of driveway, to ensure guest has a rousing send-off.
