OPERATING NEWS

The major event of 1991 is of course the opening of the extension which more than doubles the original stretch of operating track to approx. 475metres. Motormen/women are reminded of the isolator at the depot end of the bridge where power <u>MUST</u> be switched <u>OFF</u>. The depot fan is the only section yet to be connected up to the main line.

TRAMCARS

Car 53 has been internally varnished and the wood for the seats is currently being cut by the Summerlee craftsmen.

Car 150 is due to be dismantled and put into store. The truck has been cleaned and repainted

by STG members and is waiting for certain parts so that re-assembly can be completed and eventually find its place beneath *Car 53*.

Car 225, since the New Year has been operating the entire service, daily.

Car 1017 has now arrived by low-loader from Cambuslang to outside the main building and will soon be moved to the depot where restoration work will eventually begin.

Car 9062 has been in the depot since the beginning of the year and is currently undergoing bodywork repair, waterproofing, window rubber replacement and eventually a repaint. - Any help offered would be gratefully received. It is also planned that the "back-up" controller be fitted with one similar to that of No. 1 end.

The recent "Spring Fling" seen over 7,000 visitors to the Park and around 2,000 on the Tramway - A new record? The Group's stall was also very successful on the day.
