





NEWS

OPERATIONS

The traction service has been provided by 53 and 9062 throughout the Summer depending on car and crew availability.

TRAMCARS

Lanarkshire 53 A new trolley-wheel was fitted to 53 after the previous one was damaged in a de-wiring incident.

Graz 225 still has problems with the emergency magnetic track brake. The Group is contacting Brian Pickup, Crich's electrical wizard, to see if he can help solve our Problem.

Glasgow 1017 Work is progressing on 1017. The canvas roofing and joinery work required is being attended to and R Armstrong. 1017 co-ordinator, has been in contact with weaving groups concerning material for seating. Undercoating of the lower half of the body is progressing. The overhaul and regauging of the truck is now essential to allow restoration to continue as planned.

Bruxelles 9062 The new chilled iron brake shoes are performing very well in service. It has been proposed to remove the compressor from the spare Brussels truck and overhaul it so that we have a spare for 9062.

The trials of the morganite carbons have not yet commenced due to problems with the adjustment of the overhead.

PERMANENT WAY

Proposed track and overhead repairs will be carried out by Peter Price Electrical Instalations on 26/27 October 1996. A 'pull and letgo frog' will be installed in the depot overhead connection during this work. An estimate is to be sought as to the cost of a new set of points to provide access to the proposed depot extension.









18 HURT IN MANCHESTER



THE ultimate railway enthusiasts video, superb footage about the only Victorian Railway system in the World which is still in full working order.


