

NEWS

Tramcars

Lanarkshire 53 has been used mainly at weekends when crews are available, weather permitting.

Graz 225 was the main service car until late July when it had to be withdrawn after receiving a broken windscreen as a result of an act of vandalism. This should have been replaced and the car back in service by the time you receive *Trolley*.

Dusseldorf 392 still remains stored outside the depot. The Museum has indicated that they don't want foreign trams in the long term at Summerlee. The Group is now assessing what outstanding expenditure is required on the car and whether this can be justified.

Glasgow 1016 See news from other Societies/Tramways.

Glasgow 1017 Has now returned to service following repairs and modifications after the unfortunate incident on 2nd Feburary. Some paintwork on the dash and bumper has yet to be completed but the car had to re-enter service due to 225's damaged windscreen.

Glasgow 1245 Peter Ramsay has been surveying the condition of the electrics on this car. Also, the suitability of sympathetically modifying this car to accommodate wheelchair passengers was being investigated by the Museum's Tramway Technician.

Trackwork

Following 1017's derailment in February, the Museum has installed a gravel 'drag' and earth bank at each end of the tramway. This is to arrest the motion of a tramcar and prevent it from hitting the traction pole at each end of the track.

Tramway Operations

Depot

There have been no Thursday depot work evenings since May. These should resume after the appointment of a new Tramway Technician.

SPECIAL EVENTS AT SUMMERLEE IN 2004

Saturday 28 and Sunday 29 August - Grand Steam and Model Weekend

Developments at Summerlee, 2004 Neil Ballantyne

2004 has been another busy year at Summerlee Heritage Park. In 2003 our visitor numbers increased by around 25% to a total of 90,705. This mainly resulted from the opening of the new play area at Easter 2003, grants for schools buses during traditionally quiet periods, various events efficiently organised by Carol Ann Kerr and long spells of sunny weather! Although this summer has not been so good, visitor numbers have continued to climb; from January to June 2004 over 48,000 people visited Summerlee, almost 3,400 higher than the same period last year. In order to maintain this level of interest Summerlee has to keep on improving and evolving. During 2004 various developments have taken place.

George MacIntosh started work as Steam and Sawmill Technician in October 2003 and has been busy throughout 2004 getting Whittock & Reid's Sawmill and Drying Shed ready to receive visitors. This structure was an eyesore for many years and is finally becoming an interesting display. The Foster steam engine now drives the band-saw, although the propulsion system for the table remains a problem. The sawmill should prove a popular new attraction at this year's Steam Fair and throughout the remainder of this summer.

In September the area next to the Miners' Rows will be transformed into an attractive and usable space, incorporating grassed areas, a herbaceous border, benches and a playing area for French boules or quoits. We have benefited from advice and assistance from the Council's Grounds Maintenance Section, a grant of £600 by Coatbridge Rotary Club as well as the hard work of Harry Laird, Summerlee's weekend site assistant.

May 2004 witnessed the departure of Bob Docherty, the Conservation Technician, who carried out maintenance work on the fleet of trams, the track and the overhead line. Bob's job is currently being advertised and it is hoped that the new Technician will continue to develop the tramway, help to train new drivers and undertake the conservation of 1245, a double-decker Glasgow tram.


Finally, efforts have continued to tidy various areas of the site that have resembled a dumping ground for many years. This will help improve the park's appearance, remove the atmosphere of neglect that some areas suffer from and provide visitors with a more enjoyable experience when they visit Summerlee.

This is a two day event to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Balloons and Boats at Blackpool on the 11th and 12th of September 2004.

The Saturday event is a procession departing Pleasure Beach at 1030 with a return trip to Little Bispham. Standard car 147 will lead with cars 600, 706, 700, 712, 702, 703, 724 and 762 following showing different cars and liveries over the last 70 years.

On Sunday Blackpool Transport opens its doors for the first time since 1988, raising funds for the Princess Royal Trust for carers. There will be buses and trams on display with workshop tours, stalls and model layouts.


The Lancastrian Transport Trust's depot (shown below) will be open during the afternoon and a free bus service will run between the two sites.




Crich Tramway Village

The current restoration project, Leeds 345 (shown on back page), is progressing extremely well, and has a target completion date of April/May next year.

The overhaul of Blackpool toastrack 166 is also progressing well. It is planned to launch the car at this year's Enthusiast's Day on Saturday **(i) Web-link** www.tramway.co.uk 25 September.

Beamish North of England Open Air Museum

Two trams collided at slow speed on the tramway at Beamish on Monday 5 July. The trams involved were Gateshead 10 and Beamish 196 (ex-Oporto tram similar to car 150 that came to Summerlee to provide parts for Lanarkshire 53). The two trams were carrying teenagers from two schools in Sunderland who were at the Museum as part of a school trip. Seven of those on board suffered minor injuries but these were in the main only bruises with around 40 other people being treated for shock at the scene. The trams collided on the single track running between Home Farm and the Colliery Village. It is unclear how the two trams came to be travelling in opposite directions on the same stretch of single. It is reported that one of the trams did manage to stop before the collision. The Museum has remained open throughout investigations and trams have continued to run on other **(i) Web-link** www.beamish.org.uk sections of the track.
